BabyIn BabyOut: A simple concept that can save lives

We've created a two-sided hangtag and dashcard to visually remind parents and caregivers about their most precious cargo in the backseat.

- When a baby or child is in the car, the driver displays the red "Baby In" side from their rearview mirror mirror or elsewhere in the car.
- When leaving the car, the driver flips the hangtag to show the green "Baby Out" side.
- We hope using the BabyIn BabyOut tag will become as common as using your seatbelt.



About our cause

Hannah Rhudy, a student at James River High School, loves kids and wants to keep them safe. In August 2018, she launched BabyIn BabyOut

as a way to help parents, grandparents and babysitters keep their babies and toddlers safe.

Facts about child deaths in hot cars

- Heat is more dangerous to children than adults.
- A child's body overheats 3 5 times faster than an adult's.
- Heat stroke begins when the body reaches 104 degrees.
- When a child's temperature reaches 107 degrees, death can occur.
- A car can heat up to 20 degrees in 10 minutes.
- 80% of the increase in temperature happens in the first 10 minutes.
- Cracking car windows or parking in the shade doesn't slow the heating process.

- Sadly, an average of 38 (or one every nine days) children die annually, according to the safety organization Kids and Cars.
- In Richmond, Va., there were three reports hot car deaths in 2018 and 52 total

nationwide, according to Kids and Cars.
